MAMMOTH AND MEMORABLE GET-TOGETHER AT MANGALURU ON 20-02-2016: The biggest ever get-together in the history of Mangaluru was held on Saturday the 20th February, 2016 at KBEA auditorium at 6 p.m. with the participation of around 375 members which is a record in itself for Mangaluru. The spacious KBEA auditorium was virtually overflowing with the members with hardly any place to sit some members are seen to be sitting on the window sills-that was the response for the call of the Organisation!!

The massive presence of about 375 members on the occasion that too on a working day is a true testimony to the level of conviction and commitment of our members united under the banner of KBOO. The meeting was presided over by **Com. B.Jayarama Naik**, President, who in his presidential address explained that there will be no gain without pain and in this context called upon the members to rally behind the banner of the Organisation and actively participate in all the union programmes with total involvement and determination. **Com. K.
